

## Language, Literacy and Communication







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
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## Maths and Numeracy

Years 2 - 6 were lucky enough to have an incredible session with Forces Fitness. It was a day full of team building, fun and laughter.






#### Attendance Matters

We are going to be working hard with families this year to raise attendance levels in school. Our target for **excellence is 97%** attendance.

A whole year has 365 days; a school year has 190 days. That leaves 175 days to spend on family time, visits, holidays, shopping and appointments.

Families are asked to note that holiday requests will not be authorised for any pupils where attendance is below 95%.

#### Wider Curriculum Experiences

Swimming: Year 6 have recently completed a three week block of swimming at Cefn Forest Leisure Centre.

"We learnt so much. I learnt how to float on my back, do the butterfly stroke, and what all of the flags on the beach mean. The best part was being taught how to safely save someone else with a pole or float. I know how to behave when I am near open water too.". All children progressed confidently and feedback from staff at the pool at the end of the three weeks was positive. One member of staff said "These children, our future generation, are a credit to the school with their politeness, camaraderie and ability to think outside of the box".

Y4 visited the Senedd and the VVales Millenium Centre where they explored an Opera workshop. Pupils were amazed to see the buildings they've been studying in their artwork this term. Gardening club have been enjoying the drier weather to begin planting.

> Year 1-4 really enjoy opportunities to develop their singing skills each week . Along with weekly Music lessons, learning to play the Guitar, Violin and drums.


#### Cynefin workshop

Years 3 - 6 were fortunate to work with a specialist teacher (Huw) from @UpBeatWales to learn about historical welsh music such as the Welsh harp and tin whistles. They also had the chance to trial welsh clog dancing. Huw answered lots of our questions and we felt a sense of 'cynefin' and pride to be learning about welsh history.











#### School Essentials Grant (Replaces PDG Access Grant) 2023/2024

This grant provides **£125** (except for Year 7 which is **£200**) to buy school uniform, equipment, sports kit, and kit for activities outside of school for your child.

The scheme for the 2023/24 academic year will begin on 1 July 2023 and end on 31 May 2024.

This grant applies to all eligible pupils of compulsory year groups (Reception - Year 11).

For Year 7 learners the grant is £200, recognising the increased costs associated with starting secondary school.

If you have already purchased the items, you can still receive the funds retrospectively.
